# **OCCASIONAL AND RESPITE CHILD CARE SERVICE**

The H&R MFRC Occasional and Respite Child Care program directly impacts the lives of local military families by offering parents access to short-term, inclusive child care as they navigate relocation, absences and transitions.

The program is open to infants eight months and older, up to children aged 12 years who are part of a military family or who are from a veteran family who has recently been medically released. Families can register for the service online and pay a small fee. If payment is a barrier, families are encouraged to work with our team for flexible options.

"By bringing children from military families together with other community members who understand the unique challenges of military life, they can feel understood and less isolated," says Shelley Hopkins, Executive Director.

This service aims to build resilience in children and support the well-being of parents/guardians by providing short-

term, inclusive child care by qualified Early Childhood Educators in a safe and welcoming space. During a session, children will enjoy age-appropriate games, connect with peers through play and social experiences, listen to stories, sing songs and much more. H&R MFRC visits the following units each month. Drop by to say hello, ask questions, and meet with one of our Military Family Navigators.


**423 SQN** - 4th Tuesday of the month at the Canteen from 11:15am-1:00pm.

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# APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE MILITARY CHILD

The Month of the Military Child (MOMC) was first established in the United States in 1986 and has since been adopted here in Canada. According to demographic research, there are over 57 000 Canadian children with at least one parent who is an active CAF member (Manser, 2019).



Military children often have a unique childhood experience compared to children with civilian parents. To be a military child it can mean having to move often, leaving the comfort of friends and familiarity behind, and experiencing an absence of a parent, or sometimes both, for a long period of time. It can also include a new house with unfamiliar sounds, a new school full of strangers, and a new community to navigate. For some military children, it means exploring a new country, language, and culture.



Being a military child means building resilience in new, and sometimes challenging circumstances. It means developing patience for meeting new friends and being accepted into new extracurricular activities. It means becoming adaptable when having to sharing a bedroom or learning about a new culture, it means sacrificing time with a parent when they deploy.

The sacrifices of military children are diverse and involve many other factors as well that are important to a child which often includes the loss of a community that was meaningful and leaving friendships, sports teams, and clubs behind and creating new experiences after a relocation. Being a military child can be challenging, yet there is often no prouder child than the child of a military member.
